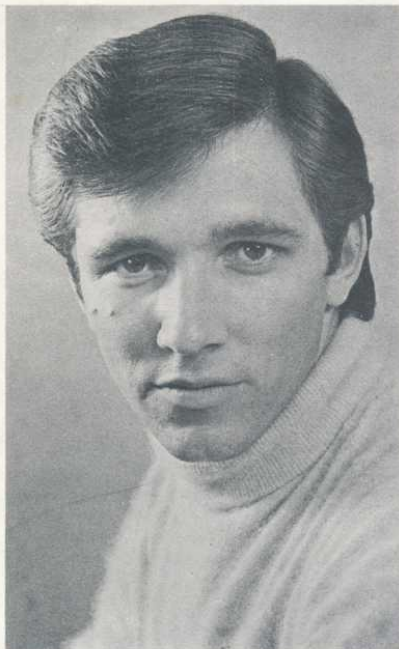


WURZELRAMA 1968

Anyone who sings and plays the guitar, is likely to be labelled Folk or Pop. Tony, who was born in Bristol in 1945, is not sure what he is, he came to folk music via the songs of Pete Seeger, Peggy Seeger and Derrol Adams, way back in 1959.

A few years later, after learning to play the guitar he started singing his way round the British folk scene, gaining songs and experience as he went, but never left off listening to his great favourite Trini Lopez.

As for his cabaret side, he has sung a lot in Belgium and France, and is as much acclaimed over there for his comedy on the piano and guitar as he is in Britain.

Now recording for E. M. I. Columbia records, his radio and T. V. broadcasts include: Childrens' Hour, Spring Song, Folk and Jazz, The Ted Ray Show, Points West and T. W. W. Reports.

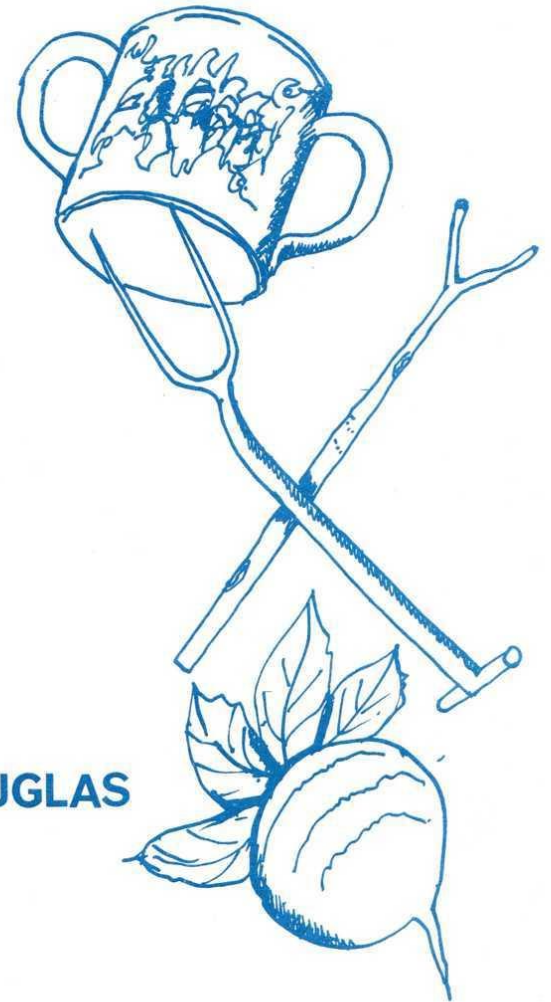
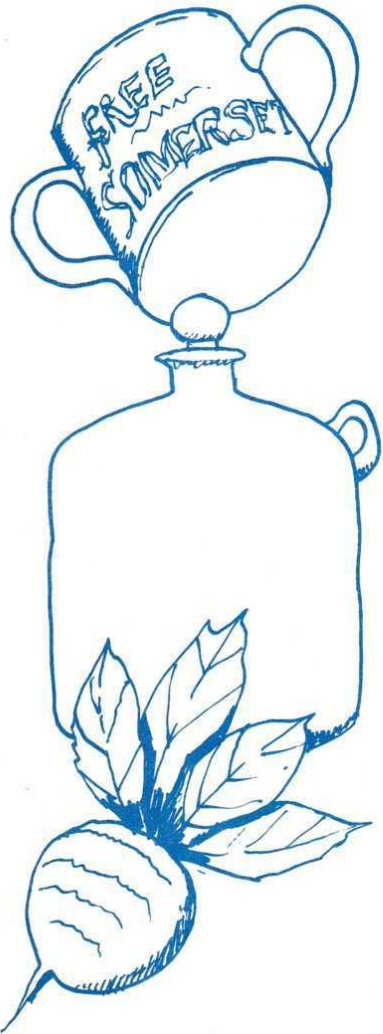
